



Group Visitor Information

Thanks for making your group reservation at the Long Island Game Farm. Please use the following information to help make your visit a most enjoyable one for both your group and our animal families.

Group Admission Procedure:

1. Group reservations must be made and confirmed at least one week in advance.
2. **One payment** for the entire group must be made. (sorry, no individual payments.)
If additional guests such as parents or siblings, accompany the group, **their admission must be paid in the one group payment in order to receive the group rate.** *If any of your group is late and not able to enter with the group they must be pre paid for - along with the group payment - and their names must be on a guest list.*

Parents or others paying separately will be charged the full admission rate.

3. We accept credit cards, cash, money orders, business checks. No personal checks.
4. Group Rate: 15-250 people \$8.95 each, Over 250 people \$8.45 each.

We must have a copy of your tax exempt form at the time of payment.

For groups that are not tax exempt, please add sales tax. $\$8.95 + tx = \9.72 .

(Any money to be reimbursed will be done in the original payment form.)

Group discount tickets available:

Carousel tickets (\$1.00 each) and Animal Food (\$4.00 per souvenir bucket full).

Please let us know how many tickets you would like to purchase on the day of your trip.

You will pay for them upon arrival and receive tickets to be redeemed at the appropriate shops.

Lunch at the Zoo: Consider ordering Zoo Meals for your group.

Hotdog Zoo Meal \$5.50 or Chicken Tender Zoo Meal \$8.95. Includes: hotdog or chicken tenders, French fries, small drink and small toy. Pre order preferred or at time of your arrival.

Woodland Gardens Private Picnic Area: Reserve Woodland Gardens for your group or corporate party. Includes tent with picnic tables. Large grassy, private area. Port-o-Potties and electric available for an additional fee. Cost: Minimum of 50 paying people at \$10.95 + tax. Includes admission to the park.



General Visiting Guidelines – Courtesy and Safety

The zoo is a fun place to be, especially when our guests respect the Zoo and each other. Please review the following information with your students and chaperones before entering the park:

1. For your safety, adults must closely supervise children at all times.
2. **Do not climb, or cross, barrier fences. Do not reach into cages. Stay on paths.**
3. We allow interaction only with certain animals. If in doubt, ask a staff member.
No one likes being picked on ... please do not chase, tease or yell at the animals.
4. For your health, and the health of our animals, please wash hands before and after contact. Hand washing stations are located outside of the Nursery and behind the People Food Stand as well as at Rest Rooms facilities.
5. Please refrain from any and all, hand to mouth activities such as eating, smoking etc....while interacting with the animals.

Feeding the Animals: People food can make our animals sick! Our animals have very specific diets. For their health and safety, please do not feed them any “outside” food. Animal safe food can be purchased in the park.

Safety: Divide your groups up and when possible enter encounter areas one group at a time. No running, especially in Bambiland and the Nursery where you are free to walk with the animals. Deer are wild animals. Though tame, they never lose their wild nature and you could startle them.

- Help keep our exhibits safe and clean ... please do not throw anything into the exhibits, as this can be dangerous for the animals.

Prohibited Items: Do not bring bbq’s, balloons, bicycles, scooters, rollerblades, skateboards, pets or alcoholic beverages into the park. No exceptions!

PLEASE DO: 1. Remember to check the schedule on your map so you can plan your visit. 2. Feel free to sit on the grass and have a rest or snack. 4. Make time to observe the animals. ..these are REAL animals. If you take your time and watch them you will see amazing things! Try this: Sit & watch the Ring Tailed Lemurs and see how they interact with one another. Do they snuggle? Do they groom one another? Are they doing yoga?

We don't like sad goodbyes ... for the safety and enjoyment of all, guests who do not abide by these guidelines may be asked to leave. The animals and staff thank you for supporting our park. Enjoy your day at the Long Island Game Farm.
